Introduction

During the summer of 2016 we conducted a survey to gain a better understanding of our Lancing community's motivations, needs and priorities. The strategy for the Foundation over the next five years will reflect some of the findings from the survey as well as demonstrate our philanthropic targets are part of a wider institutional strategy.

The feedback from the survey showed a real preference of financial support for both transformative bursaries and the Chapel's Porch Completion project. Lancing's life-changing bursaries have been part of its ethos and culture since its foundation. One of the early recipients of the scheme was John Sankey, School 1880–1885, who came to Lancing from Cardiff on a bursary arranged by his local vicar as his father had died leaving a widow and six children. John died peacefully in 1948, a century after Lancing was founded, and his legacy to his old school continues today, as it inspired so many other benefactors to follow in his footsteps. Most of his considerable fortune was left to the College to help others benefit from a Lancing education and we are committed to continuing his work today.

A small sub-committee of the Foundation Council has been formed to work through the principles which

need addressing to streamline the process of fundraising and propose a strategy for the future. It was agreed that draft proposals for a strategic direction would be presented to the Council for further discussion. These proposals will incorporate the findings from the survey, along with a review of our bursary fundraising aligned to the school's priorities and strengths with achievable targets. The results of this review will be presented in next year's annual report.

We are also looking at how best to bring together the powerful network of over 10,000 people who make up the extended Lancing community. Our aim is for current pupils, OLs, parents, current and former staff and other friends to enjoy a lifetime's association with the College both socially and professionally. We know that long-lasting and really strong friendships are made at Lancing and that there will be benefits for everyone in being part of a larger dynamic group.

Thank you to all of you who have donated so generously to the Lancing Foundation in the last year. We are indebted to you for agreeing to support us in our mission to be true to our foundation and charitable status. Your gifts have a far-reaching impact and help us to continue to light the fires of inquiry in young hearts.



Report from the
Bursar



The incredible journey for all of us at Lancing College is continuing at full steam as, with the full support of the Governing Body, the new senior team continues to rejuvenate all three schools in the Lancing family. Our strategy is to create the best and most popular school in Sussex, with investment in our estate, our academics and our marketing.

In September 2016 we opened the beautiful new wing at Handford House which has created 30 new boarding pitti and accommodation for a live-in Matron and Assistant Housemistress. This is part of the process of creating a truly co-ed school with equal numbers of girls and boys. The new wing looks fantastic and the resident girls certainly have one of the best views in Sussex to wake up to in the morning.

The invigoration of our other House accommodation is largely completed and we now have homes for our pupils which we can be very proud of. The challenge moving forward is to maintain the standard which we have achieved to ensure that we do not have to play catch-up again in the future. Our work on other maintenance at Lancing is progressing well as we cheerfully tackle roofs, windows, stonework, heating and a myriad of

other routine projects. The Forth Road Bridge springs to mind.

Our new Equestrian Centre opened for business in January and we are looking forward to Harry Meade visiting us to formally open the facility in June. The main yard will be dedicated in memory of his father, Richard Meade, Olds 1952–1957 and his distinguished equestrian career. The Equestrian Centre is already proving to be a hit with our own pupils and will shortly be opened to the public.

The Foundation has helped fund a number of projects over the last year. The Grubber has been refurbished and has a very smart new thatched roof. It would be marvellous to be able to do the same for the Pavilion but this may have to wait a few years until we have more funding. The clock at the Pavilion has been repaired and the steps down to the top pitch have



been renewed. Over the summer we are closing the swimming pool so that the changing rooms can be renovated, some plant renewed, and the windows and roof replaced. Many thanks to the Foundation for helping us with these jobs.

Bursaries continue to be a vital part of our public benefit and you will read about our ambitious aspirations for transformational bursaries elsewhere in this annual report. The Foundation's support for transformational bursaries will allow me to concentrate College funds on smaller bursaries. These are fundamental in tackling the affordability issues which are faced by many parents in the independent sector as staff and compliance costs continue to rise due to changes in tax and other legislation.

On a lighter note, those of you who have visited us for lunches and dinner will have noticed that our catering provision has stepped up a gear or two as we welcomed our new Catering Manager, Mrs Hannah Bond. Mrs Bond has completely revolutionised our food in the two terms that she has been with

us and a number of us here at College are having to watch our waistlines carefully.

Lancing Prep Hove continues to thrive and has an energetic new Head, Mrs Kirsty Keep. We are nearing completion of the new hall which will free up more space for classrooms in the main building and allow us to grow pupil numbers to around 300. Mrs Keep has ambitious plans for the fabric of the school which we will endeavour to meet!

Lancing Prep Worthing has been further transformed over the last year with the addition of a stunning new library (funded by the Foundation) as well as a new Food and Nutrition Room. Over the summer we will be building a new Drama and Dance Studio thanks to a very generous anonymous donation. The people of Worthing and the surrounding areas are starting to stand up and take notice of this fantastic school and it has been a pleasure working with Mrs Heather Beeby, the Head, over the last year.

It is a great pleasure to be able to support Lancing's bursary campaign. It is a terrific opportunity for me to show the importance of love and support I have for the school that gave me some of my fondest memories.

I grew up in Hong Kong and started attending boarding school in the UK at the age of 14. I remember very well meeting Jim Woodhouse, Head Master 1981–1993, for the first time.

Mr Woodhouse made me feel incredibly welcome during my interview. He read out one of my English report cards from my previous school, which happened to be my worst subject, and commented on how there was quite a big discrepancy on what the teacher wrote and how I did in my entrance exams for Lancing. He encouraged me to follow my heart, keep working hard and told me "we welcome you with open arms". The two short years at Lancing were the happiest time in my life. It is because

of that experience that I feel it is important to celebrate relationships and recognise the lifelong impact that the school has had on me.

I left Lancing and went on to study BSc in Town Planning at UCL. While I was working as a Project Manager for a development called Cyberport in Hong Kong, I studied at the same time for a Diploma of Building Surveying. As an OL, I am a strong believer in giving back. Lancing gave me many opportunities that I couldn't have achieved anywhere else and made me appreciate things in a whole new different way. I want to make a difference to help support a school that once supported me in many ways. I hope all of you can too.

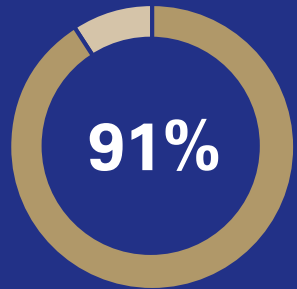

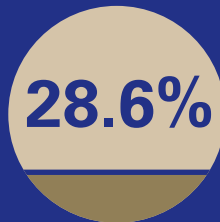

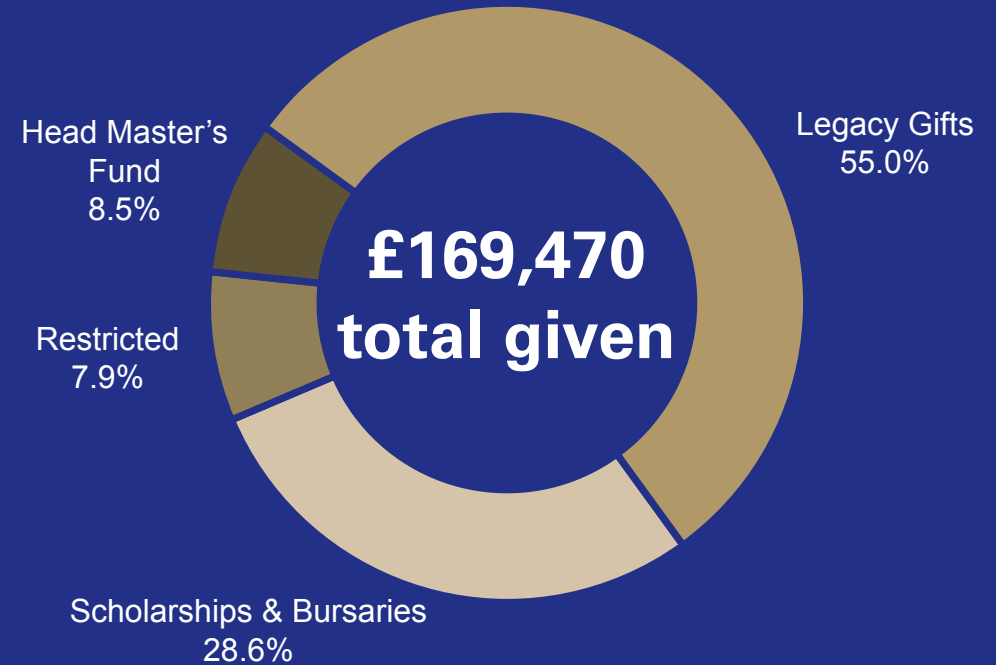

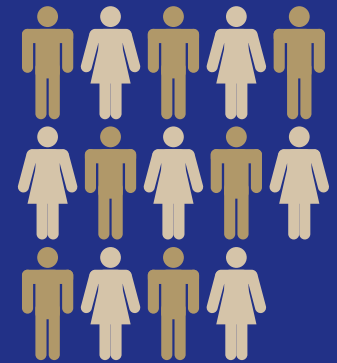
